## During the last year scouts have had the opportunity to take part in:

#### **Jeux son Frontieres**

Scouts were given the opportunity to take part in the 'Jeux son Frontieres' camp which took place at Vogrie Country Park. There was 18 scouts who attended in total over the course of the weekend. This was a games filled camp full of challenges chosen to encourage team building and participation.


### **JOTT & JOTI**
